The fire began on 2nd September 1666 and lasted just under 5 days.

It started around 1am in Thomas Farriner's bakery on Pudding Lane.

It spread so quickly because it had been a long and dry summer and the houses were built from wood and very close together. There was also a strong wind and flammable materials.

There was no fire brigade in London at the time, so, people had to put it out themselves.

One third of London was destroyed in the fire and lots of people lost their homes. Samuel Pepys' diaries give us lots of information about that time.
